MARINHEALTH MEDICAL CENTER

MarinHealth Medical Center is a 327-bed independent hospital with deep roots in the community. They have been meeting the healthcare needs of the North Bay in the Greater San Francisco Bay Area since first opening their doors as Marin General Hospital in 1952. The hospital has grown right along with the community. A 116-bed addition was built in 1961. In 1981, Cedar Pavilion was opened. To keep up with the North Bay's burgeoning population and meet California's latest earthquake safety standards, Oak Pavilion, a 260,000-square-foot, state-of-the-art new hospital replacement building, was introduced in Fall 2020.

As the only full-service, acute care hospital in Marin County, MarinHealth Medical Center provides comprehensive care across all major service lines. The Level III trauma center and emergency department receives 70% of the County's ambulance traffic, and provides life-saving care for stroke and heart attack patients. They also offer the only hospital-based labor and delivery unit in Marin County. The community's patients count on the Medical Center for advanced medical expertise, technology, and sophisticated treatments in an exceptional healing environment. In keeping with their commitment of treating the whole person—body, mind, and spirit—they also offer patients the opportunity to complement their medical treatment with integrative therapies at their Integrative Wellness Center.

As a district hospital owned by Marin Healthcare District, MarinHealth Medical Center answers only to the community they serve. This gives the hospital the flexibility to plan care that truly addresses their community needs. Building on a

decades-long relationship, MarinHealth and UCSF Health have formed a strategic alliance that expands access to high-quality clinical care in Marin County and throughout the North Bay.

SONOMA VALLEY HOSPITAL

Sonoma Valley Hospital (SVH) is a 51-bed, full-service acute care district hospital located in the City of Sonoma, California. It was created by the community and has served residents of the Sonoma Valley in its current location since 1957. Currently, SVH services a population of approximately 42,000 people residing in the Sonoma Valley Health Care District. SVH is the sole local provider of acute inpatient care in the area and offers 24-hour ER, inpatient services with an ICU, surgical services, and outpatient clinical testing and treatment.

In 2018 the Hospital announced affiliation with UCSF Health. Sonoma Valley Hospital has received national recognition for its excellent safety practices. The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services has given SVH 4 stars, which ranks them among the top 25 percent of hospitals nationally for quality.

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SONOMA COUNTY

Just 40 miles north of the Golden Gate Bridge, the City of Sonoma and the surrounding Sonoma Valley provide the perfect blend of a friendly, small town, wine country community with the entrepreneurial culture of the San Francisco Bay Area. Also known as Valley of the Moon, Sonoma Valley is found in the scenic southeastern corner of Sonoma County. Conveniently located, Sonoma is 21 miles from Novato, 12 miles from Napa, 20 miles from Santa Rosa, 42 miles from San Francisco, 48 miles from Oakland and 65 miles from Sacramento. Sonoma is accessible to local Charles M. Schulz County Airport in Santa Rosa and international airports in San Francisco, Oakland, and Sacramento.

Sonoma County's 1,576 square miles are a sprawling garden of organic produce, free-range meats, and since 1824, grapes. Tourism and agriculture are the major economic drivers for Sonoma Valley. Sonoma County frequently ranks as the top wine destination in the U.S., and second only to Tuscany in the worldwide rankings. Sonoma County is bordered on the west by the Pacific Ocean and giant redwood forests; and on the east by Napa County.

Sonoma County is known for its wineries, artisan cheese makers, craft breweries and distilleries, art galleries, historical sites, health and wellness spas, a plethora of culinary experiences, musical productions, festivals, and other special events. For the outdoor enthusiast, hiking, cycling, outdoor yoga, canopy tours, and hot air balloon rides provide something for everyone. The median age in Sonoma Valley is 49.2 years and the rate of high school graduates or higher education is 95.3%. Sonoma Valley offers a wide variety of housing from apartments and condominiums to single family homes and Victorians. In addition, there are farms and ranches for small and large families alike. The median housing price in Sonoma is \$752,515 or \$605 per sq. foot.
